



Junior Second Referee Presentation

1. Go to www.VolleyballRefTraining.com
2. Place your cursor over "TRAINING MATERIALS" in the menu
3. Select "Junior Training" from the drop-down menu
4. In the middle of the page, select "Junior Second Referee Clinic" from the list of available clinics
5. The video will play automatically and includes audio, so an audio/speaker system is necessary
6. The video is approximately 26 minutes long
7. Use the controls at the bottom of the video screen to pause a slide to answer questions, or to rewind to review a specific slide, or fast forward to advance to a subsequent slide (NOTE: You cannot fast-forward to a slide you have not yet viewed, and a pop-up screen will appear and you must click "ok" to continue viewing the current slide)

REQUIRED SECOND REFEREE EQUIPMENT

1. Whistle with lanyard (required)
2. Timing device (recommended; no cell phones!)
3. OVR junior second referee certification card (required after April 1)

IMPORTANT POINTS FOR OVR JUNIOR SECOND REFEREES

1. Brings own whistle
2. Attend the captains' meeting & time warm-ups as designated by first referee
3. Checks line-ups correctly
4. Correct positioning to observe receiving team at beginning of each rally
5. Transitions to blocking side of net during rallies
6. Focuses on net play; doesn't follow the ball away from the net
7. Repeats first referee's signals at the end of each rally
8. Loud, clear whistle
9. Controls substitution procedures
10. Understands/whistles net and center line faults
11. Manages time-outs & time between sets (with first referee's assistance)
12. Stays focused/pays attention for entire match
