

## Junior Officials' Development Program

### *Barb Strome, Junior Officials' Development Director*

Hi,

My name is Barb Strome and I'm the new Junior Officials' Development Director for the OVR. I have big shoes to fill (Al Herbert's) literally, but also figuratively. Since I am relatively new to the region, having moved here last August, I am still learning much about the largest region in the country. I can use all the help I can get! Feel free to e-mail me with all ideas and suggestions for the upcoming season as well as anything that occurs throughout.

I have a few new ideas that I'm hoping will be useful in the training process of our junior scorekeepers and second referees. I would like feedback from coaches, club directors, and officials with regard to the first of those new ideas: training and rating days set up throughout the region for the benefit of all teams and clubs. I'm thinking maybe in Cincinnati, Dayton, Columbus, Toledo, Akron, Charleston, Pittsburgh areas. The teams would gather for a "playday" early in the season, and at the same time the junior officials would have a clinic, followed by on-court training and practice. The idea would be for each club team to certify at least one or two scorekeepers and second referees that day. Then as the season

progresses, additional players could receive their cards at future tournaments. Each player would pay \$1 to cover the cost of renting the gym facility. The OVR would cover the cost of the adult clinicians/referees who would be on-court all day, teaching and rating the players. The coaches/players would do the officiating for the scrimmages in their normal work team assignment. I have experience with this type of "playday" in my former region, and when Jimmy McKenzie did this in Cincinnati last year it was very successful.

As in the past, if a club would prefer an individual clinic, that is still available. You would simply need to contact me with some dates and times, and I would schedule a clinician in your area to fit your needs.

I'm hoping this idea sounds good to you. A clinic early on in the season, certified players early on, and scrimmaging early on. If anyone would like to host a "playday" in their area, please contact me and we'll discuss logistics of size, numbers, dates, etc. My address is [strome@ovr.org](mailto:strome@ovr.org).
