**Forums**

**What are the Club Directors' and Tournament Directors' Forums?**

Bill Zehler, Tom Kohl, and other OVR officers and staff will lead these new, informational sessions for juniors' club and tournament directors, providing valuable dialog in our large and busy region. We'll provide information, answer your questions, and listen to your ideas.

**Who should attend?**

Each juniors' club is strongly encouraged to send a representative, and all juniors' tournament directors are strongly encouraged to attend.

**IMPACT**

**What is IMPACT?**

IMPACT, an acronym for *Increased Mastery and Professional Application of Coaching Theory*, is a 4-hour course for the volunteer or beginning coach. Emphasis is on drill development, principals of learning skills, resources, and ethics.

**Who must attend?**

The OVR requires all coaches to be either IMPACT- or CAP-certified before they begin working with players in practices or tournaments. Coaches who are hired/retained before their club season begins must be IMPACT- or CAP-certified before their first contact with players. If coaches are hired/retained mid-season due to extenuating circumstances, they must be IMPACT- or CAP- certified that season if they are hired/retained before the region's last clinic. If they are hired/retained after the last clinic, then they must be IMPACT- or CAP- certified before their first contact with players the following season. **CAP**

**What is CAP?**

The Coaching Accreditation Program is a comprehensive, multi-level coaching education program that covers all aspects of coaching and teaching volleyball. Both Level I and II courses focus on the critical athlete performance principles in coaching.

**ASEP**

**What is ASEP?**

The *American Sport Education Program's* volleyball course is a valuable tool for all club directors as well as for coaches and parents. It covers issues such as club philosophy, coaches, parents, risk, finances, and events. There will be round table discussion and the sharing of ideas between established and new clubs. We will discuss region-specific issues such as OVR Championship format, tryouts, and recruiting. We strongly encourage all club directors to consider attending this program.

**Who must attend?**

Each club must have an ASEP-accredited representative within 2 years of its inception. Returning clubs without an ASEP-accredited representative must send someone to the December course. New clubs are strongly encouraged to send representatives, as the course will provide information valuable to getting their programs off to a strong start. **What are the Professional Officials' Clinics?**

The Ohio Valley Region's *Professional Officials' Clinics* are free, annual clinics for certification and recertification of professional USA Volleyball Officials. At each clinic, you will be given a wealth of information about becoming certified as a USAV official. This includes the testing and evaluation process, officiating philosophies, and "How To" FAQ, as well as rule comparisons between high school, collegiate and USAV, and the USAV rulebook. We well also take you through a scoring example.

**Who must attend?**

All professional officials, new and returning, must attend one of our professional officials' clinics each year. Returning officials should register online at [www.ovr.org/register/](http://www.ovr.org/register/) by October 31, which includes signing up for a clinic and updating their profiles.
