# **OVR Plans Breakthroughs for 2006**

The Ohio Valley Region will introduce many exciting improvements for the 2005-2006 season, offering opportunities for everyone. The OVR board of directors and officers solicited members' input, secured great venues at excellent prices, and creatively developed plans to make our 2006 season even better than last year's.

For the first time ever, 17s and 18s will not be required to play on Friday night at the *Ohio Valley Region Kaepa® USA Girls' Volleyball Championships*. This will be possible thanks to Ron Wyzynski, whose years of negotiating with the Greater Columbus Convention Center enable us to use the facility at rates we can afford, together with the army of staff, officials, and laborers who work the event and assemble/disassembe the 60 courts.

The *Ohio Valley Region Boys' Regional Championships* will also get an incredible boost. For 2006, the *Boys' Championships* will become a 2-day tournament, showcasing volleyball at the *Arnold Classic Sports Festival* at the Veterans' Memorial in Columbus.

Men's and women's tournament quality

will increase through professional officiating not only for playoffs, but now also for pool play. This removes the requirement for players to become certified as officials, relieves teams of the responsibility to provide a first referee, and will improve officiating in the critical pool phase of adults' competition.

Brian Hemelgarn redesigned our professional officials' clinics, developing separate curricula and times for new officials, returning P1 and P2 officials, and returning Regional through National officials. These new formats will allow clinicians to focus officials' particular needs and expertise.

The OVR website will also offer new ways to help tournament directors and officials find each other efficiently, to ensure that registrations are completedly promptly, to improve reporting of men's and women's tournament results and standings, and much more.

Please take some time to read the columns by OVR staff and officers, and look through the various results for your favorite teams. Above all, enjoy the best season yet in the Ohio Valley Region!

### **Election Results: OVR Board of Directors**

8 strong candidates vied for 5 open board seats in the 2005 OVR election. OVR adult members case 300 ballots at the April and May championships events and by mail in this hotly contested election.

Bill Zehler (234 votes), Terry Miller (207 votes), Art Faura (175 votes), Glenn Purdy (152 votes), and Kirby King (152 votes) placed 1st-5<sup>th</sup>, winning board seats. Keith Burke

(111 votes), Jeff Putz (70 votes), and Paul Claridades (63 votes) placed 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>, missing seats for the current term.

The 3-year term for Bill, Terry, Art, Glenn, and Kirby begins on June 1, 2005, and extends through May 31, 2008. Elaine Viney, OVR Elections Chair, coordinated the election and counted ballots.

# Commissioner's Corner

# **Bob Price, OVR Commissioner** & **President**

The Ohio Valley Region board of directors and staff spent many hours this summer to guarantee your 2006 volleyball experience will be exceptional! I want to personally thank the many juniors' club directors and coaches who attended the August 7 forum in Westerville.

The 2006 juniors' season should be a very positive experience *if* parents and players make themselves familiar with the policies/procedures that govern junior participation. Please visit the website and review the juniors' page. The information provided will assist you in your selecting the proper club.

#### Selection of a Club or Team

Your selection of the proper club is the *most* important decision you will make to guarantee a positive experience – not the clubs' selection of your son/daughter! The club philosophy *must* match your needs and expectations of your son's or daughter's athletic ability.

Please be thorough in your selection process, as you can play for *only one* club during the 2005-2006 season. Some clubs promote a winter and a separate spring season. You are *not permitted* to change clubs during the 2005-2006 season!

USA Volleyball rules state: Section 5, Definitions and Guidelines for RVA sanctioned Regional and Interregional Competition Article X Section D - 2D: "A player shall represent no more than *one* club or team in sanctioned competition during the same season."

What does that mean? *Releases and transfers do not exist!* The contractual season is November 1, 2005 through October 31, 2006.

#### Juniors' Tryouts


Please review all tryout procedures, which are posted on the website (www.ovr.org/juniors/tryouts/

policies.php)! Pay special attention to the dates *when* tryouts may begin, the length of the tryout, and the cost. Club directors and coaches are not permitted to require athletes to contractually commit for

10 calendar days following the tryout! The Ohio Valley Region's policies and procedures governing tryouts and participation must be adhered to: failure to do so will result in penalties for the club, coach, and/or player.

#### **Eligibility and Coaching**

Parents must be aware of the Ohio High School Athletic Association governing coaches. Your athlete cannot be coached by *any member* of their respective high school coaching staff — that includes paid coaches as well as volunteer! High school coaches



All OVR programs are required to have persons in authoritative positions involving juniors' players pass background screening procedures. Require administrators to provide proof of completing that requirement for all coaches and adult supervisory staff.

I wish you a successful Jr. High/High school season! I hope to see you on the court!

# The Juniors' Page

# Bill Zehler, OVR Juniors' Program Director

NOTHER SEASON... MORE RECORDS. We didn't get to 12,000 female junior athletes, but 11,880 was pretty close. There were 945 teams in the *Ohio Valley Region Kaepa\* USA 2005 Girls' Volleyball Championships*, including 21 teams in the



10-and-Under division. We had a record 52 teams compete in the 2006 USA Junior Olympic Girls' Volleyball Championships in Salt Lake City, Utah. Three members of the USA Volleyball Junior National Team hailed from the OVR (Christa Harmotto, Bryn Kehoe, and Ami Stevens).

#### **Grade Level Teams**

The grade level category for Club teams was a huge success! Many of our clubs took advantage of this opportunity for athletes who did not meet the USA volleyball age requirement. Other regions *still* do not recognize these waivers. Therefore, teams

planning to play out of region in 2006 will have to participate at the age level of their grade level athletes (one age group older).

#### 10-and-Under Teams

The number of 10-and-Under teams in the region went from 17 in 2004 to 27 in 2005. Tournament directors graciously hosted several tournaments throughout the region for the age group. We encourage clubs to grow this division. Boys are welcome to participate in the age group on a co-ed or gender-specific team. Only one club took advantage of this opportunity in 2005.

#### OVR Girls' Championships

We are pleased to announce some exciting changes to our convention center format for the *Ohio Valley Region Kaepa® USA Girls' Volleyball Championships* in 2006. There will be no Friday night play for 17s and 18s, and the 15-and-Under age group will no longer have extended downtime between pool play and playoffs. We have tried for years to get away from playing on Friday nights at this event. We now have the space and the courts to do it!

The event will host 60 courts on May 6, 7, and 13 and 44 courts on May 14. The 17s and 18s (and probably all 16s) will be assured they will participate on a Sunday. The format will avoid conflicts with softball and track, and lessen the impact of proms on team composition. We will be able to accept 896 teams over the two weekends. We anticipate this should increase the participation of our oldest age groups in the event. It will not alleviate the problem of trying to accept every team that wishes to participate.

There is a cost associated with this improvement. The expenses associated with hosting the event will show a marked increase! We will use more officials and have greater staffing needs. The cost of labor for placing and taking up the floors will be impacted the most: not only are we using 20 more courts than last season, 16 of the courts have to be assembled and taken up *twice*! We have no idea what the price of gasoline is going to do to shipping costs The event has cost \$175 since it's inception. The cost for participation in the event in 2006 will be \$250.

We're looking forward to a great season of competition. Tom Kohl is planning many region hosted events for both Club and Open teams. Keep checking the website for announcements on all of our programs for Junior clubs, teams, and athletes.

# **Juniors' Tournaments**

# Tom Kohl, OVR Jrs' Tournament Director & Boys' Program Director

WOULD PERSONALLY LIKE TO THANK ALL THE TOURNAMENT DIRECTORS for their help this past season. A total of 103 tournament directors were responsible for 980 sanctioned regular-season juniors' tournaments. Very few incidents of incorrect pool play and/or tournament play occurred. Tournament bond checks were deposited, mailed, or shredded by June 15.

#### **Tournament Application and Results**

Online application for sanction of tournaments was successfully implemented. Online recording of tournament results and timely return of the *Report of Event* were improved. Thanks to Nick Nystrom for his efforts. We began accepting *Applications for Sanction* for juniors' regular-season tournaments on September 1 [www.ovr.org/juniors/sanction/].

#### **Power Challenge**

The formation of a series of mini Power tournaments concluding with the Open Power Challenge Championships in March was well received and will be conducted again. Club Challenge tournaments will be implemented for the 2005-2006 season.

The Juniors' Regular-Season Tournament Rules and Procedures have been reviewed and e-mailed to Tournament Directors for their input. The 2005-

2006 version of the *Guidelines and Rules for OVR Juniors' Club Directors* will be published soon.

A Club Directors' meeting was held on August 7. Comments and concerns from this meeting were shared with at the OVR August board meeting. Thanks to Art Faura, Al Herbert, and Bob Price for their help.

#### Growth of Boys'Volleyball

Boys' volleyball continues to grow. 13 clubs registered 61 teams. 39 OVR teams participated in the 2005 USA Junior Olympic Boys' Volleyball Championships. A tentative boys' schedule for 2005-2006 has been developed from input from the OVR boys' club directors. The OVR has decided to host a large 2-day boys' tournament on January 28-29 at the Greater Columbus Convention Center.

# Ohio Valley Region-Molten® 2006 National Bid Qualifiers Al Herbert

The Greater Columbus Convention Center will be the site for 14s'-18s' divisions of the *Ohio Valley Region-Molten*® 2006 National Bid Qualifiers. The 2-day tournaments will be held on Saturday, April 8th and Sunday, April 9th. We are still contracting with a Columbus site for the 13s' and 12s' tournaments. We are planning on holding the 13s' tournament on Saturday, April 8th and the 12s' on Sunday, April 9th.

Unfortunately, the 2005 Bid Qualifier Tournaments lost approximately \$30,000; consequently, the price will have to increase to better balance the tournament's budget. For the 5 age groups playing in the Convention Center, the price will be \$600

per team. This price compares with other tournaments. We guarantee a minimum of 7 matches, working out to less than \$100 per match. Other national qualifiers charge about \$725 for 7 matches (over \$100 per match), and the Girls' JOVC guarantees 9 matches for \$900 (\$100 per match).

The cost of the 13s' and 12s' tournaments will be determined once a site is contracted.

T'S SEPTEMBER AGAIN – fall high school and collegiate volleyball, leaves changing colors, and the USAV season only a few months away.

The 2004-05 season brought many changes to USA volleyball, primarily in rules and techniques. As has always been the case, OVR referees stepped up to the plate and hit a home run! We quickly and efficiently adapted to the new FIVB rules and mechanics. Across the country at national level tournaments, I consistently heard, "The OVR must be doing something right because [we] can tell who the OVR officials are at this event." Great work! Keep it up!

We finish the 2004-05 season with a record number of referees: 415. Thanks to the OVR rating and training team for their efforts and hard work in evaluating 150 prospective referees! I need to offer a personal "thanks" to Tom Joseph who spear-headed the training/evaluation process for our new officials. For the coming season, we will focus on continued training and evaluation of our existing cadre.

For 2005-06, rule changes will be minimal compared to last year, but there are still a couple of significant changes which we'll address those at clinics prior to the season. Likewise, we'll be adopting some new techniques and mechanics. Remember, change is a good thing, and we should look forward to incorporating some new things into our "game."

As this season winds down, we need to recognize some of the accomplishments of our fellow officials this year. Elaine Viney and Gary Hesse both completed their certification as National Scorekeepers at the US Open Championships in Denver. It was

a busy year for Gary, as he also obtained his Junior National referee certification during the Girls' Jovc in Salt Lake City. Congratulations to both of them!

We also need to mention a noteworthy retirement from officiating: Bill Noffke has decided to retire after 51, yes - 51 years as a coach, player and referee! Bill will leave as a Regional referee who has

provided a substantial service to the OVR and the sport of volleyball. Thank you, Bill, and best wishes for a relaxing retirement.

With the new season just around the corner, our online registration system is up and running. Our ovr dues will again remain \$50 this season. Remember, our USAV membership expires on October 31, 2004, so we *all* need to register online as soon as possible. For referees who completed background screening last year, that check remains in force for this season also, so there's no additional fee (\$20).



Finally, the OVR website will again be a primary means of communication for all of us this season. Details about online registration, testing, clinics and new officials' information will be available in a timely fashion. Please stay up to date by checking the website a few times each week.

Thanks to our entire cadre of referees for a super job in 2005, and let's make 2006 even better!

### Hank Trimble Elected as Men's Tournament Director

At the August board meeting, the OVR board of directors elected Hank Trimble as Men's Tournament Director.

Hank brings considerable experience to the position. Many players from OVR men's teams will recognize Hank from the court, where he played last season with Miami Valley Masters. Bid events, skillfully assimilating incoming results, reporting results, and developing brackets from up to 40 courts.



#### I have 4 requests for the 2005-2006 season:

Members who did not submit payment or required paperwork will not be allowed to register this year until they have completed their outstanding registration requirements. To verify that your club's or team's registrations were complete, please check the OVR website.

*Teams*, 2004-2005 www.ovr.org/archives/2005/dir/team.php

- 2. When sending payments and forms for online registrations, please include a copy of your registration receipt. Attach the payment listed at the bottom of the page and only the paperwork that is associated with that registration.
- 3. Directors of all men's and women's tournaments will be able to check the *Men's and Women's Teams* (www.ovr.org/mw/teams.php) to verify that participating teams are eligible.
- 4. If you wish to have additional insurance for the same facilities that you used last year please let me know as soon as possible.

# Highlights for the OVR Verification Officer for 2004-2005 include (as of 8/8/05):

- 6,509 out of 6,515 transactions (99.89% complete)
- Manually verified 35,823 pieces of paperwork, one at a time, out of 36,241 required (98.85% complete)
- Followed up on all missing information for 15,903 members (98.85% complete)
- Collected membership registration fees (99.85% complete)
- Verified 115 juniors' teams and 4 adults teams to nationals in TIVA and an Excel file (100% complete)
- Individually verified 27,025 junior certifications in TIVA to the national office (115 teams × 5,405 individual certifications × 5 verifications) (100% complete)

- Manually verified 192 adult certifications in TIVA to the national office (100% complete)
- Answered 13,487 e-mails (100% complete)
- Developed an Excel spreadsheet to keep track of all overpayments/underpayments (100% complete)
- Developed and maintained an accurate filing system for over 20,300 forms
- Prepared daily reports for the Executive Director/CEO
- Processed 83 requests for additional insurance for 31 clubs, the OVR, and 73 facilities
- Processed 21 requests for generic insurance for 19 clubs and 2 facilitie
- Processed and verified 2,513 background checks through ssci
- Completed background checks on out-of-region officials and verified to the Referees' Chair
- Maintained separate files and records for officials' registration
- Updated many IMPACT certifications for coaches
- Updated members' information in the OVR database as requested by the membership on a regular basis



#### Registration

- 2005 regisration data were presented and discussed (see page xxx).
- The OVR will continue to use its online registration system, periodically uploading data to the national office.
- Club affiliation must be declared at registration.
- Members with outstanding fees or paperwork will not be permitted to register for 2006 until all obligations are fulfilled.
- Juniors' club directors and adults' team reps should reside in the region in which the club or team registers.

- Background screening results for OVR members included 2,408 total screens, with 40 flagged and 1 disqualified.
- In 2005, 14 coaches never completed background screening despite repeated e-mails to correct this oversight. Ovr procedures must take a hard line about this procedure so that an individual cannot coach until the background screening is completed.
- Verification through TIVA was problematic because of the limited access given to regional verification officers.
- Steve Donahue will speak at the December ASEP meeting to outline problem areas an associated consequences.

#### **OVR Facility**

• The OVR will soon be part owner of an LLC offering a \$4M facility in Hudson, Ohio. The facility will have 4 courts, also offering other sports, and is tentatively scheduled to open in September 2007.

#### **Finances**

- OVR salaries are less than 20% of total budget, whereas other nonprofits are 25% or over.
- Expenditures this season included computers, projectors, and a trailer.
- Relationships with sponsors, including Q-Sport, continue to be mutually beneficial.
- Sales of the *OVR College Pack* continue to generate revenue and provide a valuable service to juniors wishing to play in college. Abby Johnson has been very helpful with marketing and sales.

#### **Juniors' Competition**

#### OVR Girls' Championships

- The OVR-Kaepa® USA 2005 Girls' Volleyball Championships went well. Additional courts were valuable: several teams were shut out the first weekend, but we were able to accommodate all teams during the second and third weekends. Total teams: 964 (new record). No teams dropped out until third weekend.
- The 2005 Girls' Championships at the Convention Center (2 weekends, 4½ days) netted \$5826.36, excluding shipping costs which are not yet available. Rising costs and expanding this tournament will require an increase in entry fee to break even.
- OVR-Kaepa® USA 2006 Girls' Volleyball Championships
- · 10s-12s: last weekend in April, Columbus-area sites
- · 13s-18s: GCCC May 6 (60 cts), May 7 (60 cts), May 13 (60 cts), May 14 (44 cts)
- This new format eliminates Friday night play, reduces conflicts, and eliminates the long break between pool play and playoffs for 15s.
- · Entry fee: \$250
- We will recompete the photography contract for the 2006 tournament.

#### Bid Tournaments

- The 2005 Bid tournament for 15s-18s at the Convention Center operated at a deficit of \$24,419.77, not including shipping costs. To continue holding this tournament at a high standard, an increase in entry fee is required.

- Entry fee for OVR 2006 Bid tournament at the GCCC: \$600.

#### OVR Boys' Championships

- The *OVR* 2006 *Boys' Volleyball Championships* will be held on March 4-5, 2006, at the Veterans' Memorial in Columbus. The Championships will be held in conjunction with the Arnold Classic, providing excellent exposure for boys' volleyball. Tom Kohl will help with organization, and Keith Burke will serve as on-site tournament director.
- The entry fee for the *OVR Boys' Volleyball Championships* will be changed to \$250 for a 2-day event.

#### Boys' Volleyball

- Only one boy participated on a 10-and-Under team (which can be co-ed or gender specific). The team reported no problems with boys' participation, which neither hindered nor enhanced the team.
- The OVR boys' program is moving in the right direction, but requires growth of high school programs to make headway together with OVR.

#### **Juniors' Tournaments**

- Tom Kohl summarized juniors' tournaments and participation by age group and weekend. His goal is to determine the optimum number of tournaments to sanction in any given weekend, offering at least two events in every section of the region
- Open tournaments will be restricted to Open teams, and Club tournaments will be restricted to Club teams.
- The seeding policy will be revisited by the seeding committee.
- Current procedures and costs for juniors' regular-season tournament entry are fine.

#### Tryouts and Recruiting

- OVR recruiting policies are unchaned for the 2005-2006 season.
- There will be no post-tryout organizational meeting prior to the 10-day waiting period.
- A club cannot have more than contact per player per weekend, not to exceed 3 consecutive hours.
- There is no change to tryout fees.

#### Grade-level teams

- The grade-level team program initiatied in 2005 was successful, with about 60% of club teams participating.
- Teams requested (and were granted)
  waivers to participate as a gradelevel teams in certain tournaments
  in the Pioneer Region, Great
  Lakes Region, and East Coast
  Championships). However, waivers
  created problems with other regions
- We must adhere to the in-region limitation of this program.

#### Juniors' Competition: General

- The region's investment in Charleston, West Virginia is paying off: the OVR staffed the first tournament, and now local club has taken over this function.
- The OVR continues to be a prime recruiting area for college coaches.

#### Officiating and Rules

- The Libero uniform is required to be solid black jersey with white number or solid white jersey with black number.
- Use of a juniors' friendship tournament for rating new officials was a positive training environment for all.
- Proper handling of background screening for new officials will be addressed.

- The majority of evaluation efforts focused on new officials, preventing adequate feedback to existing officials. Limiting new officials to 25-50, through improved pre-screening of applicants, would alleviate this problem.
- There are problems with the rating process, e.g. people submitting rating slips for tournaments at which they did not officiate.
- Officials can be sanctioned for officiating events above their level, and tournament bonds may be retained for tournament directors who do not hire appropriate officials.
- If official cancels an agreement with a tournament director, the circumstances should be filed as an *Incident Report*.
- 3 officials were suspended due to improper conduct. We must continue to emphasize professional conduct of officials both on and off the court.
- Brian Hemelgarn will bring a proposal detailing sanctions for officials to the October meeting.
- As the region grows, it is increasingly difficult to staff our tournaments with quality officials.
- The size of the OVR necessitates sharing the workload and delegating functions.
- Approximately 22 officials registered in 2004 did not return, some of whom were junior officials who graduated.
- Officials must be re-rated. Those
  who conform to feedback can go on,
  while ratings may have to be lowered
  for those who cannot.
- The possibility of allowing Junior Officials to officiate 13s and 14 Club was discussed and dismissed.

- Considerable discussion on a variety of topics ensued; Brian Hemelgarn will follow up separately and at the October board meeting. Topics included:
- · Should P1 responsibility include all but 16O, 17O, and 18O?
- What is the best compromise to prevent inadvertent assigning of inappropriate officials?
- Grass-roots efforts should be expanded, encouraging new officials to stay in officiating and to bring in additional new officials.
   For example, recruit Junior
   National officials to lead classes throughout the region in the fall.
- Should officials be reassigned to tournaments appropriate to their level?
- · Should Junior National officials be used to a greater degree?
- Should the Early Bird be used as an opportunity for Regional officials to gain experience with higherlevel competition?
- Should only Regional and above (or P2 and above) be used for Regionals?
- What can be done to help with assigning for the region's larger tournaments? Would offering several regional assigners be a useful service?
- Clinics sites and locations must be established and published as soon as possible.

#### Scorekeeping

- Sufficient time must be allotted for th scorekeeping presentation at officials' clinics.
- Having the first referee sign the score sheet worked out well, and the signature field has been added to USAV score sheet.

 Due to limited use for scorekeeper patches among regions, there will not be a new patch design until the current inventory is depleted.

#### Jr. Officials' Development Program

- 60 certified clinicians were provided to club directors for running clinics throughout the region. No club director seeking a clinician failed to find one. At least 28 clinics were given.
- The page of junior officials' certifications will be revisited to improve ease of use.
- Barb received many reports of outstanding work teams, and only 2 negative reports.
- Approximately 12 players showed interest in the junior officials' program, of which 7 were certified as new junior officials.
- Additional work is required to help junior officials find assignments once certified.
- Both Columbus and Pittsburgh offered 10s' and 12s' events, which may be possible training sites.

#### **High Performance**

- The cost per player is about \$1000, funded by revenue from coaching education and player fees.
- The best players should not be involved in the region's HP program, but rather trying out for the national program.
- Don recommends keeping pure FIVB rules for the older division, but going to 9 players rather than 12 and adding a team. The additional cost could be covered by current CE revenue.
- Don Burroughs is officially retiring from coaching HP, to continue instead as Head of Delegation.
- We will actively recruit coaches for HP. CAP certification is required.

- The 2006 tournament is likely to host 24 HPC, 24 Junior, and 12 Youth team. The tournament will be in June to avoid conflicting with Nationals; hence, our program will have to start earlier.
- The OVR will look into getting boys involved in HP.
- Don requested acquisition of video cameras for coaching and feedback.
- Clear statement of purpose must be given to players and families participating in High Performance. Is the primary objective to win or to provide a positive learning experience?

#### **HP** Tryouts

- 145 players attended tryouts, of which 2 teams of 12 were selected.
- Tryout participants should be nominations by club directors.
- 3-4 tryouts throughout the region could lead to a selection process for the final tryout.
- We must reach the best players, and if we send the best players, everyone should play.
- Bill Zehler will bring a proposal for revisions to the HP program to the October board meeting.

#### **Coaching Education**

- Don bought a website for High Performance and Coaching Education, which will be linked from the OVR site.
- CAP may have reached saturation. In the future, CAP I and CAP II may be offered on alternating years.
- USA volleyball is restructuring the CAP system.
- Don will continue to delegate clinics to instructors. Jeanne Colpus is a valuable addition to CE.

 Late fees and online signups greatly helped with on-time registration.
 The maximum number of late registrations per clinic was 7.

#### Results from the YJOV Meeting

- If the 6-1 sub rule applies, field more HP teams of fewer players.
- The OVR should send 1-2 people to Colorado Springs in January for training and to instruct OVR coaches.
- National HP would like to promote beach volleyball.
- USAV will pursue some sort of automated seeding system or systems to seed national tournaments.
- USAV will develop wording to deal with intentional forfeits.
   Consequence: no participation for the rest of the tournament.
- If a forfeit is involved in pool play and a tie results to go to the Gold level, then all 3 teams will compete in the tiebreaker.
- If 3-game matches are held for 3team pools, then the third game will be treated as a deciding game, with a new coin toss.
- Boys' bid tournaments are considered one event, even if held on multiple weekends and at multiple locations.
- All girls' qualifying events will set their entry deadlines at least 6 weeks prior to the event.

#### Men's and Women's Competition

- For all adults' tournaments in the OVR, the tournament director will hire all-day officials to work the pool and bracket play. The tournament entry fee will be changed to \$110.
- 2006 Ohio Valley Regional Volleyball Championships: April 8-9, 2006, Greater Columbus Convention Center
- 7-8 boys' teams participated in men's tournaments prior to the boys' season.
- Loss of the Kent State facility negatively impacted men's participation in northeast Ohio.
   Additional support is also rquired in Northwest Ohio as well as in other areas of the region.
- 41 of 74 men's teams are registered with the *Team Ohio* club. Whether this is creating opportunities or stifling growth requires careful examination.
- Each registered adults' team must have at least 6 unique players (excluding age-group teams).
- Compliance with uniform requirements is better but still needs improvement.

#### Other Results from ROD Meetings

- Bob Price discussed the formula for determining bids allocated to each region based on junior population
- Two online region newsletters per season is acceptable.
- The Competition Division requests input from ROD regarding competition format and structure.

#### Awards

- Award presentations for 2004-2005 can be improved.
- 2005-2006 awards committee: Jimmy McKinzey (chair), Steve Donahue, Glenn Purdy, Elaine Viney, Emi Vishoot.
- Jimmy will present a proposal for better presenting and publicizing awards.

#### Miscellaneous

- Radios for use at large tournaments were purchased 8-10 years ago and are now failing. The region will purchase replacements after securing the best price.
- The OVR has a new attorney, Mike Fults, who has a volleyball and is located in Westerville. The base insurance policy through ESIX is for \$2M per event, with a deductible of \$25,000. Secondary sports accident insurance has a \$25,000 limit.
- There may be interest in forming sitting teams in Cincinnati and in neighboring regions. Servicing outdoor players and the disabled are two areas the OVR has not yet addressed.
- An OVR booth at the AVP event in Cincinnati would be valuable for promoting indoor and beach volleyball in the region.


